Theme

The first thought our team had when approaching this project was that we wanted to create interventions that would bring together the people of Jimbolia and the region. We wanted to make references to the brick factory not necessarily by using bricks as a material, but by abstracting the shape and looks of bricklaying and putting that in our design. With this concept in mind we came up with two distinct ideas for the Second pond and the Herisanu pond.

As the Second pond is constantly drying out and it becomes rarer that the whole pond is full of water we decided that we place a land art there, which viewed from above will show the typical bricklaying design that everyone is familiar with.

We also wanted to give the Herisanu pond's users direct access to the water for recreational uses such as paddleboarding, paddleboating, kayaking and other water activities that do not use motorized vehicles. The perfect solution for this was to make a concrete pier that would also act as an open stage for the city's cultural events. We designed the pier in such way that when viewed from the front it would appear to be like a bricks.

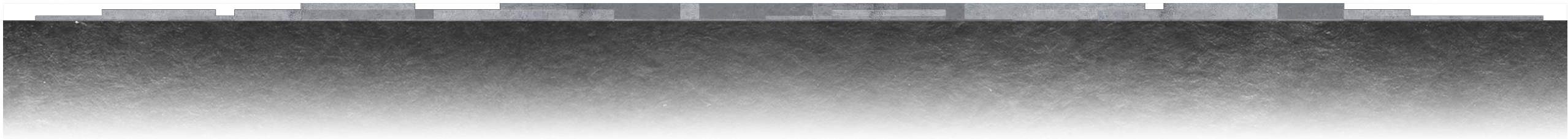
We wanted to showcase the wildlife of the Fifth pond and to make it possible for the locals to have a point from where they can birdwatch or just simply enjoy the beautiful views of the Banat's field landscape or the city's grid. Also by creating this high viewpoint we would also like to help the understanding of the land art and the concept behind it. The inspiration for this watchtower was the brick chimney often used in 20th century brickfactorys.

LandArt

Using the bricklaying pattern we created a land art that uses big bricklike formations to make sitting places for people. By digging in the ground rectangular shapes and letting the water fill those holes we were also able to create some natural mirrors.

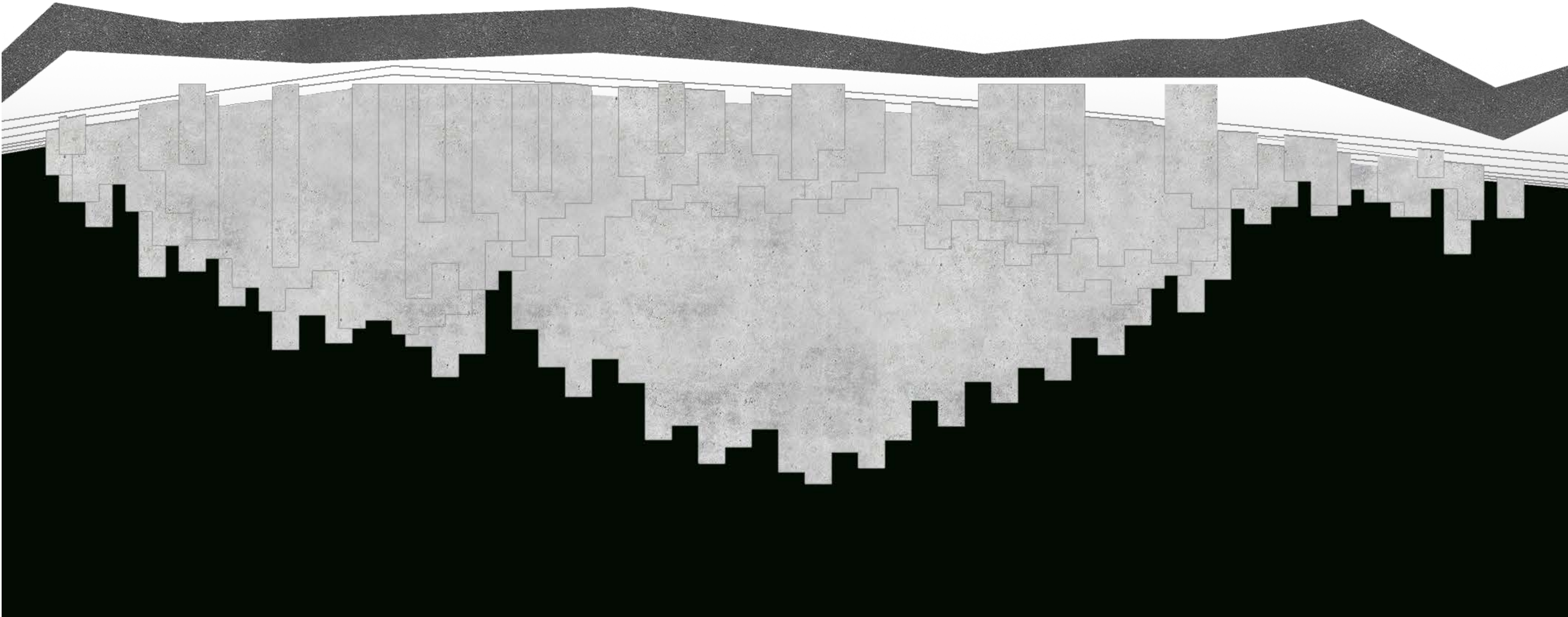
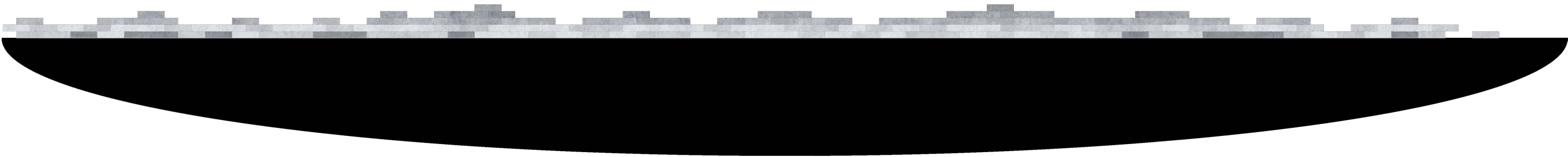


Pier
